Owning a gun is a serious responsibility. Using guns safely and keeping them out of the hands of individuals who should not have access to them are the two main priorities of Michigan Gun Owner. If you handle guns safely and responsibly and then project that onto the people around you, they will do the same. Make sure that if you let someone handle or use your guns, they use them in a safe and responsible manner. If that is in doubt, then you should not let that person use or handle your guns.

Get Trained!

If you are going to own a gun, for whatever reason, you should take a class from a certified instructor on how to safely operate and shoot the gun. There are a lot of schools and independent instructors out there who can train you; and in most cases for not a lot of money. Getting professionally trained is worth it.

Children and what to teach them about Guns

Every parent, whether you have guns in your home or not, will have a different opinion on when they feel is the best time to teach their children about guns and how much to teach them. Below is some advice that we hope will help everyone on this issue.

Young Children

Young Children are curious and will certainly pick up a gun as if it was a toy because they don't know any better. They should be taught what guns look like, that they are dangerous, and that they should not be touched. If they find one, they should be taught to not touch it and to come and tell you immediately. They should be taught the difference between toy guns and real guns and the differences between movies and TV as compared to real life.

Adolescents

When children get older and are able to play independently outside of your watchful eye, they should be taught not to be around or accept a gun from anyone without your consent. If one is offered or shown to them they should come home immediately and tell you or tell the closest adult or Policeman. Only if you hand them a gun or with your approval should they touch one.

How to use a gun

At what age should you teach your children how to use a gun? That is a question only you as their parent can answer. You might start by remembering what age you learned to shoot; but the best advice we can give you is to ask yourself these questions. Do they understand what a gun is and what is it used for? Do they understand the difference between a real gun and a toy gun? Can they hold the gun up and shoot it safely? Do they understand the safety rules? If you can answer yes to these questions they are probably ready. Keep in mind that children learn from watching their parents. So if you handle guns safely and take it seriously, they will too.

The match is made up of four stages. Each one is 2 sighter shots and 20 shots for record at 600 yards for 200 possible points. The first two stages are fired with scope sights and the second two are fired with iron sights.

After an hour and a half rain delay we got started. After the two scoped events three people had 400 points. Three others had 399. The scores stayed close all day.

Awards were given for service rifle and match rifle classes.

- The service rifle was won by Andrew Timmons with 727-9x.
- In the match rifle class first Sharpshooter was Andrew Borkon with 748-20x.
- First master went to Kelly Snider with 781-31x.
- Second High Master went to Dennis Selfridge with 797-46x
- First High Master went to Steve McGee with 799-55x
- Match winner was John Myer with 800-53x. To set a range record

A special recognition and congratulations goes to Shirley McGee. She shot a 200-18x in one scoped stage to set a range record and also a national record.

Sundays team match started with near perfect weather. The match is fired with two man teams. Each member shoots one twenty shot sting with scoped sights and one with iron sights. Coaching each other is allowed. Five teams entered.

Second placed was taken by Brad Mosiman and Greg Krebaum with a score of 796-37x

First place was taken by Steve and Shirley McGee with 798-53x

To help understand the accomplishments of these people you should know all shots are fired from the prone position with a sling as the only other support. The 600 yard target x ring is six inches in diameter. The 10 ring is 12 inches across. Throw in wind, haze, sun, pulse and normal body wiggles it gets interesting.

Notes From Caitlin Morrissey on NRA National Championships and More..

Kansas --(AmmoLand.com)-Wow! What a summer it has been! In June, I competed in the USA Shooting National Championships, held annually at Fort Benning in Columbus, Georgia. After a solid smallbore shooting match, I walked away from the Women's Prone Championship as the Junior Women's Prone Champion. I also finished as 3rd Junior in the 3-Position Women's Championship.

Then, in July, Dad and I traveled to the NRA National Championships, held annually at Camp Perry near Port Clinton, Ohio. One of the many traditions at Perry is the tricky weather. During the 3-Position phase, it rained and was rather windy. Although this posed a challenge for the competitors, the match still went on without delay.

After the first day of competition, which was shot with metallic sights only, I was on top of the junior and women categories. The weather for day two was better, but still tricky for the any sights match. I hung in there and fired a solid score, keeping me near the top of the leader boards. The final results were posted and there was my name, at the top of the junior category for the entire 3-Position championship.

The next morning was the firing of the team matches. Because I was not there with a team, I slept in a little bit, then got up and ready and went to play "cheerleader" for my buddies on the United States Army Marksmanship Unit Team. That evening was the awards ceremony. We got all dressed up and walked over to the post auditorium.

Not long after the start of the ceremony, and the presentation of team awards, the lights went out. After a bit of scurrying around and flashlight searching for the problem, the executive decision was made to open the doors and carry on. So, the side doors were opened and the audience was lit up, even though the stage was still dark. During that ceremony, I was called to stage to receive numerous awards, to include Junior Champion for 3-Position Smallbore Rifle. I was also awarded a Walther KK300, presented to me on stage by Charles Pearson, President of Champion's Choice, and Hichem Hanafi, Export Manager for Walther.

The next morning, the prone phase began with the metallic sight championship. Although the sky looked like it could pour rain on us any minute, it held off. The wind was tricky at times, but manageable. I held in there with decent scores, enough that is to qualify for the Randle Team Match.

The Randle Match is an International Team Match that members must qualify for during the metallic sight championship at Camp Perry. The top ten ladies, plus two alternates are selected for the team. Firing happens at 7:00 am the morning of the team matches during the prone phase.

Following prone team day, was the any sight championship. The weather was very favorable and almost perfect for shooting on the first day. I fired a 1200/1200, my first time ever shooting a perfect score in an outdoor prone match. I guess if there is a good time to do it, Camp Perry is the time and place. The weather got a little more tricky the second day, but I fired a solid score, enough once again to hang in there.

Although I didn't win any overall prone championships, I didn't end up too shabby. I won my Expert-Junior class/category and I still got to go onstage to receive my bracelet and charm for making the Randle Team.

Overall, Camp Perry was very successful this year and therefore was a lot of fun. It's always MORE fun to shoot, when you are shooting well!

As most everyone knows, I will be attending Texas Christian University this fall and will be competing for TCU on their Women's Rifle Team. Although I will be busy at school, I hope to get the chance to continue writing to the shooting publications in Kansas to keep everyone back at home updated. And to answer everyone's first question about TCU, yes, we are the Horned Frogs and proud of it!

Start making your plans for Camp Perry and USASNC 2010 now! I hope to see you all when I am home and visit the range, but until then, keep shooting!

Three Anti-Gun Bills on Governor's Desk – Urge Governor to Veto Bills

Three Anti-Gun Bills on Governor's Desk – Urge Governor to Veto Bills

The following three bills negatively affect the ability of law-abiding citizens and retailers to buy and sell firearms and ammunition. These bills will be delivered to Governor Schwarzenegger this week.

NSSF engaged in a prolonged battle in the California Legislature, but unfortunately on the final day of session, three anti-gun bills narrowly passed. The bills include: ammunition registration (AB 962), added retailer paperwork (SB 41) and prohibitions on firearm and ammunition sales at the Cow Palace exhibition center (SB 585).

NSSF and the California Association of Firearms Retailers (CAFR) urge all gun owners in the state to contact the governor's office and respectfully urge him to veto these anti-gun bills.

Once again, the business environment in California will become more difficult for retailers during a time when the state is in desperate need of revenue.

More information on the bills:

AB 962 – Would require that firearms dealers and other vendors of ammunition keep a registry of all buyers of handgun ammunition. The bill would also ban all mail order and Internet sales of handgun

ammunition and reloading components.

SB 41– Would further burden firearms retailers by requiring additional paperwork and documentation on the date of delivery of all firearms to a buyer. This bill equally affects consumers of firearms as the increased dealer costs would be passed along to the purchaser.

The bill also requires dealers to sign and to obtain the signature of the buyer or other transferee of a handgun on the Department of Justice Dealers Record of Sale (DROS) form indicating that the handgun has been delivered and the date upon which the delivery was made. It would further require dealers to date and sign a form stating that the buyer of a rifle or shotgun had taken possession of the gun.

SB 585 – Would prohibit the lawful sale of firearms and ammunition at the Cow Palace exhibition facility near San Francisco, located in Agricultural District 1-A, and would make a violation of that prohibition a crime. Its purpose is to ban gun shows at the Cow Palace and to set a precedent for the banning of all gun shows at other state-owned facilities where many sportsmen buy firearms and ammunition.

In California all firearms bought and sold at gun shows must be transferred through a federally licensed firearms retailer who is required under federal and state law to run a background check on the prospective buyer.

It Is Critical That Everyone Contacts The Governor's Office Immediately.

Waterfowl And Deer Hunting Changes Announced For The C&D Canal Wildlife Area

Delaware --(AmmoLand.com)--The Delaware Division of Fish and Wildlife has announced that waterfowl hunting in Scott's Run along the C&D Canal will only be available this year through mentored youth hunts coordinated by the Delaware 4-H Shooting Sports Program. In the past, Scott's Run has been open to the public for waterfowl hunting on a first-come, first-served basis.

"Participation in hunting is declining in many areas of the country," noted Division Director Patrick Emory. "Part of the reason for this decline is that there is no one available to take a young person hunting. This program at Scott's Run will provide experienced hunter/mentors who will give young people a safe and enjoyable hunting experience. This may get a young person interested in hunting more in the future."

The 4-H Shooting Sports Program includes courses for ages 8-18 and is offered free of charge. The mentored youth hunts are open to ages 12-18. To sign up, or for more information, call Jim Kimble at 302-376-1945.

Another small change at the Canal involves deer hunting. A sliver of land along the south side of the Canal lying west of Scott's Run will be closed to hunting.

"The exact boundary line between U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' property and private property is unclear," said Ken Reynolds, Wildlife program manager with the Division. "We don't want to put the public in a situation where they may be cited for trespassing. There is also a safety issue since the narrow parcel runs along a public road."

This closure will result in the loss of hunting on approximately 70 of the 5,178 acres available for hunting on the C&D Canal Wildlife Area. Refuge signs will be posted along the road to alert hunters of the closure.

Smyrna, GA - (AmmoLand.com)- The International Defensive Pistol Association (IDPA) Nationals were held at the United States Shooting Academy in Tulsa, Oklahoma from September 23-26, 2009. Team GLOCK Shooting Squad Captain Dave Sevigny won his 8th IDPA National Championship in the Stock Service Pistol (SSP) division along with the High Gun Industry category while teammate Randi Rogers won her 3rd title in the High Lady category.

The IDPA Nationals was host to more than 350 competitors during the four day annual defensive pistol shooting tournament. Participants fired a minimum of 241 rounds through seventeen courses of fire which featured moving targets, a shoot house, low-light scenarios requiring use of a hand held flashlight, shooting from cover and prone positions including from in and around motor vehicles, with target distances ranging from three to ninety feet.

Team GLOCK Captain Dave Sevigny dominated the competition with an overall best time of 222.56 seconds and won fourteen stages in the Stock division with a GLOCK 34 in 9×19. Stock division runner-up Gordon Carrell and 3rd place finisher Phil Strader, scored 260.46 seconds and 264.01 seconds respectively with S&W-M&P pistols. Sevigny has now won the prestigious IDPA National championship eight times in ten appearances and finished in the top three overall in each contest; the only competitor to accomplish such a feat. "After beginning in the GLOCK Sport Shooting Foundation I joined IDPA so there's some tradition here. It was a good competition and I was happy to compete at the IDPA Nationals once again," said Sevigny.

Randi Rogers of Team GLOCK won the High Lady title in 7th place Stock/Master class with a final score of 309.42 seconds with a GLOCK 34 in 9×19. "The IDPA Nationals was a pleasant end to the 2009 shooting season. I look forward to take what I have learned throughout the season, perfect my craft during the off season and come back even stronger next year," said Rogers. "A favorite stage of mine was Stage 8 named "El-Prez At The Movies." This was a 12- round, three target, Limited Vickers stage. The course of fire required a start with only six rounds in the pistol, then to draw and engage each target twice, complete a mandatory reload and re-engage each target twice with no make up shots. I shot the stage in 9.40 seconds with two points down for a total time of 10.40 seconds. This time placed me 5th out of 31 Master-class Stock division competitors on this stage," added Rogers. Twenty-eight women, roughly 8% of the field of competitors, were entered in the ladies category in 2009. Three-time Ladies IDPA National champion Julie Goloski-Golob finished in 14th place Stock/Master class and was the High Lady runner-up at 327.78 seconds with an S&W M&P.

Another notable finish came from Enhanced Service Pistol division champion and High Law Enforcement winner, Robert G. Vogel, who used a GLOCK 34 in 9×19 with a score of 230.47 seconds to capture his 3rd IDPA National championship.
